<b>POSSIBLE BREEDING</b>	<b>CONFIRMED BREEDING</b>
<b>H</b> In suitable nesting <b>habitat</b> in breeding season	<b>NB Nest building</b> , including carrying nesting material (except wrens and woodpeckers)

<b>D</b> <b>Display</b> involving male & female (display, courtship feeding, copulation) or antagonistic behaviour between ≥2 individuals (territorial disputes or chases)	<b>CF</b> Adult <b>carrying food</b> for young
<b>V</b> <b>Visiting</b> a probable nest site in suitable habitat	<b>NE</b> <b>Nest</b> containing one or more <b>eggs</b>
<b>A</b> <b>Agitated</b> behaviour or alarm call of an adult	<b>NY</b> <b>Nest</b> with one or more <b>young</b> (seen or heard)
